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CHIPINGE TOWN COUNCIL MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS SINCE THE NEW DISPENSATION ERA

The Council Chairman, Councillors, The Town Secretary, Management, Staff and residents take pride in being associated with the success of the ZANU PF Conference 2025 being held in Mutare under the theme "Attainment of Vision 2030 through Economic Empowerment & Value Addition"

Chipinge Town Council is the 3rd largest town of Manicaland situated 188km South-east of Mutare. Chipinge Town Council has a vision of becoming a town with socio-economically empowered and well served communities by 2030 which augurs well with the national vision and NDS1. Council has the mandate to provide services to citizens of Chipinge town which include but not limited to potable water supply, roads construction and maintenance, refuse collection, waste water reticulation and town planning services. In its endeavour to provide services to residents, Council is guided by a 5-year strategic plan running from 2021 to 2025 and a host of policies such as Annual Plan, performance contracts and M&E assessment forms. Since the ushering in of the New dispensation to date Chipinge Town Council performed fairly well where a number of projects were achieved through devolution funding, NGOs, own funding and ERRP.

As part of our efforts to create a thriving and sustainable community, Chipinge Town Council has successfully implemented various projects and programs. Highlights of our achievements among others include the following projects that showcase our council's unwavering commitments to serving the needs of our residents.

ROADS

A number of projects under the roads section were conducted using the devolution, and Council funds from the period 2019 to date. A total of 10,07KM road surfacing and resealing was done. This has improved accessibility and trafficability. The local authority also managed to purchase road equipment like dumper trailer, Motorised Grader, road Compactor, Tipper and TLB. The major road surfacing projects undertaken by Council include the following;

In a bid to improve and increase road network Council has procured a motorised grader, road compactor, Tipper Truck and TLB. Though the road equipment is not yet enough but this gave Council a better edge in as far as road maintenance is concerned.

WATER AND WASTE WATER RETICULATION SYSTEM

Chipinge Town Council water system has been upgraded from 5 Mega Litres/day to 10 Mega Litres/day against current demand of 9 Mega Litres per day. The major works done included construction of a 500mm diameter pipe which runs parallel to the existing 300mm pipe, construction of the pump house with 3 heavy duty pumps, Construction of clear well and sedimentation tanks at the Bangazani Treatment plant, 3x tank rehabilitation and sewer reticulation system for Gaza A with a communal septic tank that caters for 325 households and to date 200 households are now connected to sewer reticulation system. The works done are shown on the following pictures. Wards 1,2 and 3 which were having serious water shortage are now receiving water for 2 to 3 times a week.




Bangazaani Treatment Plant Upgrading (Construction of 5ML sand Filter and Clear well)

Council benefited from Government assisted procurement of state of the art fire tenders. This has reduced fire damages to property as Council now have the capacity to extinguish fires before causing serious damage. Of late Council used to have one fire tender which was not sufficient to extinguish fires. The delivery of the fire tenders tremendously help the whole District in terms of fire and road accidents.

PROCUREMENT OF OPERATIONAL VEHICLES

Council observed that there was a yawning gap in terms of efficiency in service delivery. As a result the organisation acquired 6 operational vehicles (3 X NP200, Nissan Almera, Toyota Gd6, Nissan Combi NV350) which led to improved efficiency in attending to service delivery issues. Council could now timeously attend to sewer and water bursts and other service delivery related issues.
